Eric Gill was one of England's leading 20th century sculptors, typeface designers and printmakers.

Ruth Lowinsky (née Hirsch; 1893–1958) studied art at The Slade, London and became a society hostess and food writer. Her husband, the surrealist Thomas Esmond Lowinsky provided illustrations for her first book *Lovely Food* (1931), published by the Nonesuch Press. Her very successful book *Food for Pleasure* (1950) was dedicated to the artist Ethel Sandys. The Lowinskys were close friends of H G Wells & Dame Rebecca West.
